Everybody's Talking!

Porcelain house: Four hundred million pieces of porcelain fragments and tons of natural crystals have been used to decorate a house in Tianjin, China. The project, completed by porcelain collector Zhang Lianzhi, took four years to finish and includes ancient pieces of porcelain dating from the Tang (AD 618-907) to the Qing (1644-1911) dynasties. The porcelain, along with ancient chinaware and white marble carvings and crystals, comes from broken or damaged antiques and covers every inch of the exterior of the large house. It's said that the collector spent \$315 million on the project and his house is now one of the biggest tourist attractions in Tianjin.

Smart crossing guard: In Wakefield, England the students at Crofton School are safely directed across the street each day by a crossing guard who has 11 university degrees. This is not the kind of job that requires even one university degree, but that hasn't stopped Bruce Berry, who explains that he took the job to give back to his community. Berry's high IQ got him into Mensa, the international high IQ society. He can also speak five languages fluently. However, it's knowing he's helping the kids get safely to and from school that is his reward. He also feels like he's a part of the school family because his father once taught there.

Expensive book: It is very likely that the personal possessions of the first President of the United States of America are worth a lot of money. That turned out to be the case when George Washington's personal copy of the U.S. Constitution, complete with his own notes, was sold at Christie's auction house for nearly \$10 million. The pristine leather-bound book, printed in 1789, was purchased by the Mount Vernon Ladies' Association of the Union, a private, non-profit group that owns and maintains Mount Vernon, Washington's historic Virginia estate. Spokeswoman Ann Bookout said, "The group was thrilled to bring the book back to Mount Vernon where it belongs."

Afraid of the dark: Fear of darkness could possibly be the explanation for some sleep problems. Research conducted by Colleen Carney at Ryerson University in Toronto, Canada discovered that half of the adults in her study who had sleep problems were also afraid of the dark. Therefore, they were more anxious when the lights went out. According to Carney, there is good news attached to this finding. If fear of darkness is the reason for insomnia, the problem can be treated easily and relatively quickly. Until Carney's study, fear of darkness had not been considered by doctors as a reason for a poor night's sleep.
