Pizza pizzazz: Talk about a large pizza! Over 100 pizza chefs in Naples, Italy, made one of the largest-ever pizzas when they got together to create a Neapolitan fried pizza. This kind has savory ingredients wrapped up inside the crust. The chefs used 83 kilograms (183 pounds) of flour, 50 kilograms (110 lbs.) of mozzarella cheese, and 7 kilograms (15 lbs.) of tomato sauce. They filled the inside with such toppings as green peppers, bacon, and basil. The whole concoction ended up being over seven meters (23 feet) long! An extra long vat, filled with boiling oil, had to be used to cook the creation.
